B. The Hancock City Council will hold a public hearing and special meeting on Wednesday, April 8, 2009 at 7:30 p.m. at City Hall, 399 Quincy St. on the abandonment of Anthony Street between Spruce Street and Emma Street, a distance of 430 feet, and on adopting the following resolution:

RESOLUTION OF INTENT TO VACATE PORTION OF ANTHONY STREET RESOLUTION #5-09

WHEREAS, A petition for abandonment and vacation of Anthony Street between Spruce Street and Emma Street, a distance of 430 feet, was received from the Hancock Public School District and Finlandia University, and

WHEREAS, Finlandia University has proposed a \$4 million three phase construction project to redevelop the Condon Field Complex into a state of the art Division III Collegiate Complex including a new softball field, two full-size football practice fields and one new soccer/football field with synthetic competition surface, new lighting, a 1500 seat grandstand, new tennis courts, and a nature trail, and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission, after advertising a public hearing in the Daily Mining Gazette on March 11th and 18th, 2009 and holding the hearing on March 23, 2009 endorsed the project and recommended to the City Council to approve the requested street vacation, and

WHEREAS, the City Council advertised in the Daily Mining Gazette on March 7th And March 25th for a public hearing to be held on Wednesday, April 8th, 2009 at 7:30 p.m. on the vacation and abandonment request of Anthony Street from Spruce St. to Emma Street, and

WHEREAS, Finlandia University in a letter dated March 13, 2009 agreed to construct a turn-around / cul-de-sac on the North end of Emma St. and in a letter dated March 20, 2009 agreed to install a new city water main to replace the existing water main that runs along the proposed street vacation and provide a new easement for the new water main route to the city, and to relocate the UPPCO electrical lines as needed, all at Finlandia University's expense;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Hancock City Council after holding a Public Hearing on the vacation/abandonment request on April 8, 2009 does hereby approve a Notice of Intent for the City of Hancock to vacate Anthony St. from Spruce St. to Emma Street, a distance of 430 feet once the following conditions are met:

- A. Construction of Phase I of the Condon Field Athletic Complex begins.
- B. The new water main is installed and an easement is received by the city for the new route.
- C. Construct a paved walking path that connects Spruce Street with Emma Street.
- D. The cul-de-sac on the North end of Emma St. is constructed.
- E. The relocation of UPPCO electrical lines is completed.
- F. Construction of a storm water collection system for the site and an onsite storm water detention pond.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Hancock City Council supports Finlandia University's Condon Athletic Complex development project that will enhance university student recruitment, provide the community with new recreation facilities, and enhance community sports offerings and programming.
